



Continuing Care Services

- PURPOSE:** To assist former residents of Open Door Youth Shelter —West Town in obtaining or retaining housing, employment, education, or additional supportive services to help them maintain stability.
- LOCATIONS:** Our Continuing Care Coordinator meets with youth at Open Door Youth Shelter—West Town, in the homes of former residents, and in Chicago’s Lakeview neighborhood.
- PROGRAM:** Residents of The Night Ministry’s shelters face challenges that are not easily remedied. After their stay at Open Door Youth Shelter —West Town or our RAPP Program, youth frequently need continued assistance as they face issues stemming from chronic or acute situations such as lack of family support and/or education, inexperience with daily living skills, and social isolation.
- SERVICES:** Before leaving Open Door Youth Shelter —West Town, residents are strongly encouraged to meet with the Continuing Care Coordinator for information on the services available:

| Public aid assistance | Use of laundry facilities |
